St. Mary's English Medium School, Chevarambalam , had its humble beginning with 50 students (LKG&UKG together), two sisters as teachers of kindergarten (KG) and one helper in the year 1996, in the most beautiful , proud, ancient Zamorin's city of Malabar. With the grace of Almighty and the dedicated passionate work of the pioneer team, it could elaborate itself to primary school. The first school building was blessed and inaugurated on February 2nd 1997. Now, the school caters students in its pre-KG, KG, primary, secondary and senior secondary classes. 12 FACILITIES AND INFRASTRUCTURE

• The entire campus is fenced and is always under the surveillance of CCTV camera, security personals, etc. are provided for the safety and convenience of the students, teachers and parents. The facilities are added time to time to meet the needs and demands of the students.

• Library

A space to explore resources and to contrive a wider knowledge in cultural, scientific, technological and educational milieu, the space which is consistent with the materials that support the intellectual growth, personal development, individual interest and recreational needs ofstudents.

The school library is equipped with immense collections of reference books and other standard books on all relevant subjects and also subscribes journals and dailies. The library is equipped with a spacious reading room.

Science Laboratory

The 'grotto and the statue' of Jesus Christ facing the road, of the secondary school, was installed as a part of Silver jubilee celebrations of St. Joseph's convent, in Kozhikode. Statue of Jesus Christ and Mother Mary, of the Primary school, which were installed as a part of Silver jubilee celebrations of St. Mary's School, proclaims the divine presence in the school campus. Silver gate of Primary school and open stadium of secondary school reminds Silver Jubilee year.

• Infirmary

Sick students are taken to the infirmary with knowledge of the class teacher after entering in the register. Essential assistance will be provided immediately for those students.

14 ADMISSION

Admission to this school is restricted by conditions of age, ability and conduct. Hence the applicants for admission will be tested and admitted to the standards, if they are found fit.

- 1) The age of admission to LKG is four plus and to standard I is six plus on or before May 31st with corresponding increase of age for the higher classes. (Since govt. of Kerala has given a relaration of age, we kept $2\frac{1}{2}$ forPre KG, $3\frac{1}{2}$ for LKG and $5\frac{1}{2}$ for Class 1)
- 2) Registration for KG admission starts from 1st week of October every year. To other classes it starts from 4th week of November.
- 3) A child seeking admission has to register his/her name by paying a registration fee of Rs. 150. There after he/she is to take a written test.

There is no written test for LKG.

- 4) Students seeking admission to class XI
- a. Class X students of St. Mary's can register for ISC, directly, after the payment of registration fees.
- b. Students from other ICSE schools, may give their application for registration, if they secures minimum cut of marks.
- c. Students from other syllabi(CBSE & state bord), are eligible to apply, if they are scoring minimum cut of marks for the entrance examination which will be conducted by our school.
- Students of above b&c category have to approach school office & complete other formalities, by March month.
- 5) When applying for admission, the following documents are to be submitted:
- a) Birth Certificate (Civil)
- b) Transfer Certificate (TC)
- c) Progress Report / Mark List (from the school last studied) d) Copy of Aadhar card
- 6) The school authorities reserve the right to refuse admission to a pupil without assigning any reason. They also reserve the right to dismiss the student whose diligence or progress in studies is constantly unsatisfactory.
- 7) Date of birth once recorded at the time of admission will not be changed.

15 WITHDRAWAL

Generally withdrawals are not permitted at the end of the school year, unless such withdrawals are warranted by the transfer of the parents or guardians to the other places. In such cases notice of withdrawal must be given in writing. The TC will not be issued unless all dues to the school have been paid. Application for TC in the prescribed form should be submitted at the office by the parents at least two weeks in advance.

1. The school authorities reserve the right to dismiss the student whose diligence or progress in studies is constantly unsatisfactory, irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience or defiance of authority, lack of sufficient improvement conduct even after warnings are, sufficient reasons for the dismissal of a student.

16 EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION

Academic year is divided into two semesters. The school holds two mid semester examinations and two semester examinations during an academic year. Besides these continuous evaluation, as class test, projects and monitoring of attendance will take place.

- 1. Promotion is mainly granted on the basis of performance of the pupil in the second semester examination. First semester attendance. performance in the class test, mid-semester exams will be considered in a few cases.
- 2. Minimum attendance of 85% is required for the promotion.
- 3. No re-examination will be conducted in any subject.
- 4. Absence or failure in any one subject exam excludes a student from being recorded in the proficicecy winners list.
- 5. The dicisions of the school authorities will be final with regard to the promotion.

17. FEE REMITTANCE

NB: School fees should be paid in three installments on or before 31st of May, August and November without fine. Next month of the due dates fees can be remitted with a fine of Rs. 50.

All must pay the fees through NLP. If any student, due to exceptional circumstances is unable to pay the fees on due date, his or her parent shall present the matter to principal and obtain extension of time for payment. However fee must be paid within the extended time without fail. No student will be allowed to sit for the terminal or annual examination unless all the fee payment have been made up to date.

The principal/management has the right to increase the tuition fees or any other fees and also to introduce any kind of additional fee even during the academic year as and when the need arises.

20. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Dear Parents, guardians and students,

You are requested to cooperate with the school in the observance of all rules and regulations laid down below and those announced by the school authorities as and when it is required.

a) General rules to the students

- 1. Each student must have a hand book which should be BROUGHT TO THE SCHOOL DAILY. It is the means of communication for the school authorities and staff with the parents about the child.
- 2. Every student shall respectfully wish the teachers irrespective of the classes they handle. Stand up and wish a teacher or a visitor when he/ she enters or leaves the classroom. Maintain silence in the absence of a teacher. Behave well even out side the school in such a way that your teachers and parents may be proud of you.
- 3. During the class hours, order and silence need to be maintained. Running about, playing or shouting inside the school campus is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Come to school always on time neither too early nor late. No student is allowed to remain in the school premises after class hours.
- 5. The school premises and your classroom should always be kept neat and clean. Since cleanliness is next to Godliness, every student shall consider cleanliness of dress and person as an essential virtue.
- 6. Any kind of damage to the school properties must be immediately

reported to the principal and made good by the respective student who caused it.

- 7. Every one should attend the morning assembly. Their movement from class to assembly and back, should be in an orderly manner. They should move silently but smartly in single line under the guidance of the class teacher or class leader.
- 8. Pupils from one class are not allowed to be in other class room during interval. When students move up and down the staircase and in the corridor, the rule in KEEP LEFT.
- 9.Prayers must be recited with respect and devotion. Pupils should not move about at the time of prayer and should be in attention while singing National Anthem
- 10. Newspapers, periodicals, transistors radios, mobile phones, smart watches, electronic devices etc. are not allowed in the school.
- 11. The school is not responsible for the loss of books, money, clothes, and other valuable articles.
- 12. Exemption for pupils from attending assembly or PT will only be granted with written permission from the class teacher.
- 13. Every student is expected to speak English in the school campus.
- 14. Scribbling on the bench/desk/ wall/ doors and windows are strictly prohibited. Spitting and washing through the window is forbidden.
- 15. No gift or donation to be given to the teachers and friends.
- 16. It is forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
- 17. Fighting, using abusive languages and offensive behaviour are strictly prohibited
- 18. Habitual absence and irregularity in home work are recorded and action will be taken.

- 19. Disobedience in any manner will be punishable
- 20. Children should not involve in robbery, cheating and forging signature.
- 21. Loitering around, in and outside the school campus during and after the class hours is prohibited.
- 22. Additional body piercings are not permitted, for example eyebrows, nose, ear etc.

b) Uniform rules

- 1. Full uniform should be worn always inside the school campus with ID tag
- 2. Tight fitting and sleeveless dress is not allowed on any occasion in side the school campus.
- 3. Use only normal black shoes (canvas, leather shoes and boots are not permitted)
- 4. You may use uniform colour cotton socks, if there is any skin allergy ailments
- 5. Fancy and gold ornaments are not permitted
- 6. Different hair styles and any kind of make up are not allowed.
- 7. Boys should have proper and normal hair cut
- 8. Elder boys should be clean shaved.
- 9. Pants should not be shaped into tight fitting.
- 10. Polish the shoes daily.
- 11. Parents should see that your ward is wearing washed and ironed uniform.
- 12. Girl's hair must be plaited on both sides, neatly with white ribbon. If short, comb neatly and wear white thick hair band. Clips should also be white in colour.
- 13. No student can insist his/her religious practices in the school uniform or any other activities and also abide by the school rules and regulations.
- 14. All students should have a handkerchief. KG students (boys & girls) must have it pinned on their uniform (left hand side of their shirt.)

c) Library rules

- 1. Library will be open on all working days from 8 am to 2.30 pm
- 2. Library book which is taken should be returned or renewed within 14-days, otherwise penalty of ₹2 will be taken per day from 15th day onwards. Fine is exempted during holidays, examinations and festivals. This exemption is only for the students who return the books on the day immediately after it.
- 3. If the book is lost, double amount of the price of the book should be remitted. Fine, for the lost book from the given date (date sealed in the front page) of return also should be paid.
- 4. Only one book will be issued to a student at a time.
- 5. The school library belongs to each and everyone. So ensure its safety and avoid causing damage to its property, fittings, furniture etc. Handle the book carefully and keep it neatly. Writing with pencil or ink anywhere in the book is strictly forbidden.
- 6. Students are expected to submit their library note book once in a month in which they have to write the brief description about the book they read. This will be valued and grades will be awarded. Make a note of read books in your hand book.
- 7. "Best readers" of the school will be appreciated.
- 8. Boys & Girls should keep separate queue in all library hours.
- 9. Bags are not allowed in the library. Keep your bags outside the library.

d) Leave rules

- 1. Every pupil should attend the class regularly.
- 2. Leave will be sanctioned only for genuine reasons.
- 3. Requests for leave must be noted in the diary and attested by the parent /guardian. Absence owing to illness/ any other reason, extending over 2 days should be communicated to the principal along with a letter/ medical certificate.

NB: All these rules should strictly be followed. If not, strict disciplinary action will be taken.

e) General guidelines for parents

- 1. Parents are expected to cooperate with the school authorities by confirming regularity and discipline, helping their children to prepare lessons and taking a keen interest in the activities of the school.
- 2. Parents should attend all the CPTM, with their ward, to evaluate the progress of studies.

- 3. Parents those who require various certificates like conduct certificate, fees certificate etc of your ward, need to submit a request in writing to the office, at least two days in advance.
- 4. Parents or other persons are not allowed to see students or meet their teachers during class hours without the permission from the principal
- 5. The school hand book is a record and means of communication with the parents.Parents have to check their ward's hand book daily. Sick students should not be sent to the school.
- 6. Criticism of the teachers of the school in the presence of your ward should be avoided, because it may make them lose respect for their teachers.
- 7. Parents should not insist on any personal religious practices in the school.
- 8. We are as much interested in your child as you are. So take us into confidence about everything related to your child.
- 9. Students who disobey, carry out an illegal or anti social activities or break the rules and code of conduct of the school are liable to have their names struck off from the school register.
- 10. Identification tags or labels should be there with all the belongings (bags,towels, water bottles etc.) of the children.
- 11. Bakery items, non- veg and junk food items are not permitted as tif- fin. Please send only the necessary quantity of healthy food needed for your ward. Please send a napkin with the tiffin.

21. CONCLUSION

The management has the right to introduce, amend or change the rules and regulations when necessity arises. Ignorance of the rules and regulations will not be accepted as an excuse for not obeying them.

22. PARENTS' DECLARATION
